I am delighted to inform you that we have secured a grant, as a school, through the Libraries for Primaries scheme for a new library. Libraries for Primaries are going to provide us with a 'flagship library renovation' worth £12,000!

This library is going to be in one of the existing Reception classrooms and will provide an amazing space for classes and parents to access. This is brilliant news! As Small Heath library is due to close, we will be able to provide a 'flagship library' for our families and local community.

The initial design and planning stage for the library will take place in early January 2025 and the library will be open around May 2025.

We will keep you informed on the progress of the new library over the coming months.
